Work is currently underway to gather information on irrigation drainage disposal basins in the local area.

This includes understanding how these values are impacted by drainage water, and the gathering of local insights and knowledge into how these areas respond to flooding and drought events.

The areas we are focussing on are Woorlong Wetlands, Doerings Basin, Karadoc Swamp, Red Cliffs South East Basin and Lake Iraak.

While these basins/wetlands play a very important role in the way salinity is managed in our region, they also

have a lot of value to the wider community.

The aim of the work currently underway is to gather techinical information about the basins/wetlands (i.e. their role in salinity management, what drainage functions these areas provide).

The techinical information will then be collated with the input from Traditional Owners, community members and stakeholders to help build a full picture of the social, cultural and economic values of these basins/wetlands.
