




## **UPDATING LOCAL FLOOD INFORMATION**



LOCAL residents are being asked to help ground-truth updates to flood information as part of efforts to plan and prepare the region for future floods.

Over recent months, a lot of work has been undertaken to date to update flood information with what was learned during the 2022 floods.

Mallee CMA has worked with local government authorities and agencies to accurately map existing structures on public land that influence where floodwater may move, such as levees, elevated roads, railways and channels.

Aerial imagery taken during the

2022 floods and associated flood records Have also been used to map the areas inundated during the recent floods.

Now it's time to ask locals to share their knowledge and experiences. Topics up for discussion include local insights on levees on public land, as well as other information that will inform emergency management during floods.

## **BE INVOLVED**

Community drop-in sessions are being held across the Mallee CMA region throughout May 2025. These drop-in sessions are a chance for locals to validate the updated flood information, identify anything has been missed, and share their experience of the 2022 floods.
